- Where a plaintiff has a condition pre-dating a tort that would have naturally worsened over time, the defendant is not responsible to the degree that the condition would have naturally worsened
- 2. A new intervening act or event that breaks the chain of causation
- Intentional intrusion into the private affairs
 of another without lawful justification, and
 that would be highly offensive to a
 reasonable person
- A tort that protects the reversioner from acts of a life tenant that might injure or despoil the land
- Falsely representing one's own product or service as that of another. with the intent to deceive consumers
- The substitution of one party for another, where the substituted party takes on the rights and remedies of the original party
- 14. A published false statement that is damaging to a person's reputation

Across:

- A lie told by a liar who knew it would cause damage or harm
- 6. The thing speaks for itself
- An intentional act that interferes with another's personal property without causing permanent damage or dispossession
- A false statement, made maliciously disparages the quality of goods manufactured and sold by the claimant
- 11. The onset of a psychiatric illness caused by witnessing the negligent action, or the results thereof, of another
- 12. The unreasonable interference with enjoyment of private property
- 13. Pre-existing conditions making a person more prone to iniury do not absolve the defendant from liability for all damages flowing from their actions
